The Section of Industry, whose main aim is to further the productive work among the Jewish population, has organized in many localities schools and courses with the purpose of giving the Jewish Youth the possibility of learning different branches of industry. Following schools and courses are already existing:

The toy school which existed until now in Zywiec has been transported to Cracow. At this school has to be organized a school of carpet making. All these schools and courses have been organized by the Relief Committee of Polish Jews and are until now subventioned by the Committee. The work is improving very well; at the end of November the Committee wants to organize an exhibition of the works of different pupils. Besides this we have located boys in artisans' families in order to give them the possibility of learning a trade.
